HISTORY RESEARCH FOR 175TH ANNIVERSARY - In honor of St. Thomas's 175th anniversary, we will continue research into the parish's history that we began in 2015. This will include organizing the parish archives, researching in various sources, and sharing the information with the parish and the larger world. Here are a few trivia tidbits:

St. Thomas's was established on August 1, 1842 at a meeting with Rev. George Allen, Thomas Blandy, Benjamin Gibbs, William S. Wilson, William Cooch, and James S. Martin. All but Rev. Allen became our first vestry. Mr. Blandy was our first senior warden and our first treasurer. Mr. Martin left quite an impression on Newark. He purchased St. Patrick's tavern, rebuilt it, and renamed it "Deer Park Hotel" after his home he called "Deer Park Farm" that was located where the First Church of Christ Scientist is today. The Grove is the last remaining piece of Deer Park Farm.

The Diocese of Delaware unanimously received St. Thomas into union with the diocese at their convention on May 31, 1843. Mr. Gibbs was our delegate. The first rector was Rev. Walter E. Franklin and he served the parish from 1845 to 1853. His daughter, Anjelica, an infant, was the cemetery's first burial in 1850. It is believed a child of Mr. Martin's was also buried in the cemetery in 1854.

The first building cost \$3,825 to build. That would be nearly \$500,000 in today's dollars. At the time of our centennial celebration, St. Thomas's parish house served as a sector dressing station. A celebratory dinner was held at Newark United Methodist Church. The bishop preached in October. A box containing historical relics was preserved for our bicentennial celebration. When the new building was built, St. Thomas's asked the city for permission to park on *both* sides of South College Avenue on Sunday mornings. The city said no to the request, citing safety concerns. What we now call the Stewardship Campaign was called "Loyalty Sunday" in 1953. The bottom of a carefully crafted letter reads as follows: "How much shall I give?" Ask yourself, "How much has God given me?"

In April, 1953, the vestry approved a resolution to raise funds totaling approximately \$125,000 for the new parish building. That would be just over \$800,000 in today's dollars.
